Joel is our newest member, and he was introduced to all who missed him at his first meeting.

April's minutes were approved with a motion by Tom Woodman and a second by John Moore.

Treasurer report by Jeff Brown. One bill was approved. Two members have been dropped from the roster for lack of dues. One dropped because of age, and efforts to contact the other went unanswered. This member has sold his Thunderbird.

Old Business: Due to illness, graduation, and vacations, Tom Woodman moved to cancel the May 19, 2024, T-Bird Appreciation Day Tour. John Moore seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the members. There was discussion that this tour may be held at a later date.

Bird Tech Talk

"Why are my new ignition points not testing properly?"

I was completing a restoration of a 1955 T-Bird tach drive distributor and prepping it to run on my Sun 404 distributor tester when I encountered something different about the new ignition points set I was installing. When I used my multi-meter to test the faces of the points for continuity when closed, I got no continuity reading. I pulled out a set of NOS Holley points from the 50s and tested them. Sure



enough, there was continuity when the points were closed. This was strange; my only conclusion was that the new points were coated with something preventing continuity when closed. A little research on several forums and YouTube videos confirmed this. I found references to an ignition points protective coating, possibly wax, which those authors recommended removing with a solvent. I also read that new ignition points are coated with tungsten to prevent premature wear and it was recommended not to burnish or file the points lest one remove this and cause premature wear. So, I tried solvents such as lacquer thinner, and 3M wax and grease remover. Neither made a difference, and I still had no continuity when the faces of the points were closed. Finally, I ran one pass of fine emery paper through the points, and this did the trick. I now had

continuity when the point's faces touched each other and lack of continuity when the points were open. I installed the points in the distributor and hooked up my multi-meter to the primary wire and to a ground. When the distributor shaft was spun slowly by hand, I could see the continuity fluctuate with non-continuity as the points opened and closed. The distributor was now ready for the Sun 404 tester.

CTCI UPDATES

CTCI Board Meeting Highlights
May 17, 2024

President Chuck Thompson started the meeting by reminding everyone that this Sunday, May 19, 2024 is Thunderbird Appreciation Day. He encouraged all members to contact their local club to find activities in their area. Most importantly he asked all members to get out and enjoy celebrating with other T-Bird enthusiasts. Finally, he wanted to let everyone know that they should take lots of pictures and send them to the office so we can add these to The Early Bird.

Treasurers Report: John is currently working on the first quarter financials and should have them ready for next meeting.





Investment Fund Update: Garrett Shropshire reported that the investment account is now greater than the original investment and greater than end-of-year 2023. The investment plan is following the previously approved "U S Treasury Bond ladder" and the yield rates are increasing as the approved plan is fully implemented.

2024 Convention Update: Marsha Hash presented the status of the 2024 International Convention to be held in Des Moines, IA from August 20-25, 2024. She noted a good news item that all of the original block of rooms have been booked at the "convention rate". She has asked Garrett to work with the hotel to obtain additional rooms at the "CTCI block room rate". Marsha also reported that the registration site that is attached to the CTCI website (**www.ctci.org**) is up and working. To date we have over 35 registrations completed. It was also noted that the May-June issue of The Early Bird (which most members will receive over the next 2 weeks) includes all of the registration information as well as a registration form for those members who do not want to register on-line. It is recommended that members register for both the Convention and the Hotel as soon as possible.

Member Renewals: Garrett presented membership renewals through April 2024. Last year (12/31/2023) we ended up with 4,015 active members. Between January and April 2024, we gained 62 new members. We converted one new member from the Test Drive Program. We are deep in the 2024 Membership drive. To date we have only received 56 notices of drop outs. At this point we still have 709 members who are pending renewal this is better than last year at this time last year and we are still above the 507 members who did not renew from 2022. The May-June issue of The Early Bird will NOT be sent to those members who have NOT renewed. This has always been a significant motivator for membership renewal.

Office Activity: Garrett also reminded everyone that we are still looking for "Modern Classic Retro" Owners and Experts. Just like for our Classic Thunderbirds, we need to identify those special individuals who can offer help to others. While we have gotten some interest, we will need assistance in Technical Areas, Rebuild Specialists, as well as members with judging experience. He encouraged any member interested in assisting to contact the office or a CTCI board member.

Director Election: Chuck Thompson reminded all members of the upcoming Director election. The election will cover Regions 2, 4, 6, and a Director-at-Large position. Each interested member should be thinking about creating a bio. Per the CTCI Bylaws, Candidate bios must be received by the CTCI office prior to August 1, 2024, and will be published in the September-October Issue of The Early Bird. If you have any interest, please see your Regional Director, Jim McLaughlin – Nominating Committee Chair, or contact Chuck for details.

The Board approved a plan to form a joint LLC with VTCI for the purpose of running a joint Convention in 2025. The current planned date for the Convention is September 9 through 13, 2025. Bob Bly and Brian Carron are tasked with finalizing the plan.

Garrett Shropshire presented a membership marketing plan to the Board. The board approved the plan with some improvements. Darcy has been tasked with Facebook posts and improvements and Garrett has been tasked with obtaining a '02-'05 Thunderbird owners listing and creating a direct marketing campaign. Both Darcy and Garrett are responsible for reporting back to the board by the





next meeting in July. At that point, the board will decide to continue with the plan, change direction with a different plan, or stop the member marketing plan completely.

The Website Committee updated the board on changes to make the website more accessible. The site was changed to remove the "login requirement" to renew membership. Since that change has been made there have been fewer complaints in getting locked out of the CTCI site.

Chuck Thompson reminded everyone that all nominations for the Paul Hudgins Award are due to the office by August 1.

Chuck also talked about the Ford Johnson Memorial Trophy (1955-57) and Ron McCloud Memorial Trophy (2002-05). They are fun competitions only for those Thunderbirds that are driven from your home to the convention site. The mileage will be counted from your Chapter President's residence to the convention site at the Sheraton West Des Moines Hotel. More information is in the May – June issue of The Early Bird.

Brett Sargent proposed and the board approved a plan to recognize 25 and 50-year members. Brett will be working with Chuck and others to finalize the details of the plan.

The next Board meeting is set for July 19, 2024

The **Omaha group** should rally at 11:30 a.m. at Plattsmouth's Casey's, Oak Hill Road, and Highway #75.



We should each bring a picnic lunch and beverages. I will lead everyone from the entrance to the picnic area and tables just down the hill from the museum, where we can stop first for orientation and to view pertinent information.

After lunch, we will take a 5-mile drive around the park to the cave area adjacent to the Missouri River. Afterward, we can parade through the park back to the entrance and to Brownsville for a stop at "Whisky Run Creek Winery" to observe their exciting business and maybe have a glass of their beautiful wines and possibly buy a bottle to take home (if inclined). The winery was built over the original caves where whisky was stored beginning in the 1850s when remarkable whisky was brewed to and through the 1920 Prohibition era. Perhaps we can go down into one of the caves currently used for wine and cheese tasting parties to experience the calm environment of temperatures in the 50's (like our T-Birds...). I have been told that an investigation of the connected caves revealed many copper utensils for brewing that were actual distilling devices when they were in vogue. FLAG DAY

ON JUNE 14, 1885, in a one-room schoolhouse in Waukesha, Wisconsin, schoolteacher Bernard Cigrand asked his students to write essays about the US flag to celebrate the 108th anniversary of the flag's creation by an act of the Continental Congress. It was the first observation of what would later be called Flag Day. Cigrand went on to advocate for the celebration of Flag Day for the rest of his life. The observation of Flag Day gradually became more widely practiced. In 1907, the holiday gained its greatest national advocate when the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks became the first national organization to celebrate it officially. In 1911, the annual celebration of Flag Day became mandatory for all Elks lodges. The first National Flag Day was celebrated on June 14, 1916, following a proclamation by President Woodrow Wilson. Wilson also led a celebration of Flag Day the following year, but national celebrations of the day were sporadic after that until 1949, when President Harry Truman signed a bill into law making Flag Day an official annual national observance. Father's Day has a fascinating history!

The first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910. The person behind this idea was Sonora Smart Dodd, who wanted to create an equivalent holiday to Mother's Day for male parents. Inspired by a church sermon about Mother's Day, she believed fathers should also be celebrated. Her father, who raised her and her siblings after their mother died, served as the inspiration for this special day. Local religious leaders supported the idea. In 1924, U.S. Pres. Calvin Coolidge supported the observance, and in 1966, Pres. Lyndon B. Johnson issued a proclamation that recognized the day. It became a national holiday in 1972 when Pres. Richard Nixon signed legislation designating the third Sunday of June as Father's Day.
